BOIL WATER NOTICE

Loss of pressure in Town of New Windsor Water System

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

BRING TAP WATER TO A ROLLING BOIL, BOIL FOR ONE MINUTE, AND COOL BEFORE USING.
OR USE BOTTLED WATER CERTIFIED FOR SALE BY THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. BOILED OR BOTTLED WATER SHOULD BE USED FOR DRINKING, MAKING ICE, WASHING DISHES, BRUSHING TEETH, AND PREPARING FOOD UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

THIS BOIL WATER NOTICE APPLIES TO:

- • • At about 9:00am on Thursday, April 16, 2020, the water system lost pressure due to a shut down for a leak repair. When water mains lose pressure it increases the chance that untreated water and harmful microbes can enter your water.

Text alerts will be sent out advising residents effected of the boil water advisory and when the boil water advisory is lifted. If you haven't already signed up for text alerts, you can do so on the Town website: newwindsor-ny.gov

Harmful microbes in drinking water can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms and may pose a special health risk for infants, some elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems. But these symptoms are not just caused by microbes in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you should seek medical advice.

What is being done?

Crews will make needed repairs as quickly as possible.

When your water is restored, it is likely that you will need to boil it for the next 2-3 days until lab results are back. You will be informed when tests show that you no longer need to boil your water.
